The play is intended to be performed in Belgrade, Pristina, Sarajevo, Zagreb, Mostar and Banja Luka. The play would be covered in a documentary film that showcases the work behind the scenes.

The main resources of this initiative would be surveys on researching attitudes, discussions, training, and summer and winter schools for students and young professionals to be organized in Nis, Serbia and Skopje, North Macedonia. The UN International Residual Mechanism for Criminal Tribunal's Information Programme for Affected Communities (MIP) will assist in implementing some of the educational activities.
